Truck Drivers Spending More Time Waiting at Loading Docks. One of the biggest complaints truckers often have these days - especially in light of tightening regulations that restrict the number of hours they can spend on duty - is the amount of time they have to spend in detention, waiting for their big rigs to be loaded or unloaded. Unfortunately for those pro haulers, the time they're spending in those situations seems to be on the rise.

Those delays added up to a nearly 40% increase in drivers running late because of "customer actions," rather than their own problems, the report said. The average per-hour fee charged by fleets during detention was just under \$64, lower than the average hourly operating cost of \$66.65. Moreover, drivers for small fleets may be at particular risk of issues, as 20% of them don't charge detention rates at all.

While drivers are spending more time in detention than they did just a few years ago, they're also dealing with more traffic that adds to their problems in a number of ways. High congestion, of course, makes it more difficult for drivers to make it to their destinations on time - especially when coupled with more time in detention.
